Electronic Newsletter Option:

For those of you who are interested in obtaining an electronic version of the newsletter, I'm going to try something new. At least for the January newsletter, I will get the usual paper copy to Jack for mailing and the newsletter will be available on the internet in Adobe Acrobat format. I will try and keep the electronic version of the newsletter down to about 300K bytes. This will allow a person to download the newsletter in about a minute when connected up on the telephone line. That's how long it took to download it on my computer with a 33.6K connection. The internet version will be better than the snailmail (US postal service) version because it will be in color. If all goes well, I would like to reduce the number of copies sent out in the mail and this money can be used elsewhere. If we could do the newsletter electronically, it would save the club around \$250 per year and save Jack Dimski some work. I can do this by e-mailing you the newsletter (around 300KB) or I can e-mail you a link and you can download it from there. If you have the capability to receive e-mail and are interested in receiving the newsletter electronically please let me know.

So if your interested in downloading a color Adobe Acrobat file, type in the following address in either Netscape or MS Explorer:

Remember that there is no "www" in the above address.

Frequency Channels:

There hasn't been a survey of the clubs used frequencies for a while. on this task, let me know. I plan on getting that information in the newsletter and out on the internet. It will help club members decide what frequency they should avoid when buying or upgrading to new radio equipment. Likewise, if you're at the field and are on a heavily used frequency, <u>make sure that you get your frequency pin</u> when your ready to fly and put it back on the board right after your through flying so others can fly.

Club Modeling News:

After the club meeting, several aircraft were presented to the members. Ralph Snow is always busy working on scaling up some type of airplane. His latest work is an enlarged version of the Black Bullet, which was a rubber band free flight designed in the 1930's

to 40's. The wing has been increased 2 ½ times the original size and has a wing area of 737in^2. Ralph plans on using an Astro 15 geared motor running on 12 cells to power the plane. The plane should weigh in around 70 oz and is controlled with rudder, elevator, and throttle.

Duane Riedel brought his scratch built Rookie. The fuselage is like the standard plank balsa box and the wing was cut from foam and covered with fiberglass. The finish is all Krylon spay paint. Power is the trusty old OS FP 40.

Bruce Anderson also brought a new Rookie that he has been working on. The tail feathers are all built from sticks and the fuselage is built from sheet balsa. The wing was cut from foam and ½ X ½" spars installed underneath 1/16"

sheeting. Lighting holes were cut in the fuselage and wing. Covering is towerkote and a Thundertiger 40 engine will supply power.



Daniel Helm and his son, Daniel Jr., came out to the field and help out by watching the poles. Duane did the starting. We appreciate your efforts at the field!


