Field CLEANUP DAY

I believe that everyone has been contacted about flying at the field. The new owner, Mr. Winters, does not want us flying at the field anymore.

We now have the task of cleaning up what is left at the field. The items that need to be dealt with include:

- the STRCC sign
- frequency control board
- wind sock
- the electric control box which houses all of STRCC stuff at the field
- racing pylons
- push mower
- weed eater
- chairs
- grill
- tables / picnic tables

We will need as many volunteers as possible to get the work done. Bring your tools if possible. The tools will be needed to remove the sign, frequency control board, and wind sock. Mario has talked to Mr. Winters, and he has agreed to take care of the outhouse, and the shade shelters. What is left at the field will most likely be bulldozed.

The cleanup day has been scheduled for July 17th starting at 9:30 A.M. The club monthly meeting will also be held at this time. After the meeting, the cleanup will begin. If a storage place for any of the items at the field can not be obtained, then those items will be slated for the landfill. Bruce has been to the Arlington landfill and the charge is \$5 per pickup.



There were five racers that showed up to run some laps. We had to fly the races with only two people on the ground as no one else showed up. But we did get to enjoy a good day of flying.

All of the races were run clean except for one. In the second heat, Bruce was able to keep close to Joe. But in order to do that, Bruce had to cut inside the pole 5 times. So much for collecting points. That adds up to a big fat ZERO!

We were able to get in 5 heats for the day and each pilot was able to race three times. Duane and Joe each finished first 2 times and they also collected a second place. Bruce had one first place finish and Mario collected two second place finishes. The points collected for the day were: Duane and Joe (14), Mario (11), Howard (9), and Bruce (8). The grand total for the year is: Joe (65), Duane (60), Howard (46), Mario (42), Craig (38), and Bruce (35). So now we know who we will be chasing when we get our field situation sorted out.

First Flight of SpaceShipOne into Space

On June 21, 2004, the SpaceShipOne, was launched into space. It is the first privateventure craft to attempt to leave the earth's atmosphere and enter space, defined as an altitude of 100 kilometers (62 miles).

The rocket-powered SpaceShipOne is slung below the twin-jet White Knight carrier aircraft. Both were specially designed by Burt Rutan and his Scaled Composites Company. Rutan is absolutely no stranger to weird and wonderful aircraft - his most famous effort to date is Voyager, which flew around the world in 1986 without refueling.
